The recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring, or receipt of persons, by means of the threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of deception, of the abuse of power, or of a position of vulnerability, or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation.²

Though data are limited and acquiring reliable statistics challenging, the number of human trafficking victims, collectively under the term modern

slavery, is estimated at 40.3 million (forced labor, forced marriage, and sexual

exploitation). As the largest group of healthcare providers, we are in a unique

position to intervene before harm occurs. It is important that we recognize potential red flags and indicators, assess all our patients'/clients' safety at

home/work, and respond appropriately when human trafficking is suspected.
